

1966-1967 SEASON.

Two hundred and twenty-four members were registered during this Season and the main fund raising ventures were Art Unions and Social Dances. \$450 (dollars had now come in as currency) was set aside from funds for the purpose of building our Club House.

The Club began to participate in the "Graded" swims at the Valley Pool run by the B.A.S.A. and our Club was fortunate to come second in the "B" Grade competition. It is interesting to note that in these early times the Club did have outstanding swimmers in its numbers and during the 1966/67 season Jane Spiro, Karen Enright and Mark Nattrass had made names for themselves in competition. Also, in 1967 saw the arrival of School Swimming Clubs in the surrounding districts and Yeronga Park Club's numbers did drop somewhat. This was to be the pattern for many season hence forth.

In Fébruary, 1967 a stunning blow was struck to the Club. Mr. Brian Rudd , Pool Leasee announced he was forming a new Swimming Club at the Pool. This Club would meet on a Sunday morning and came to be known as The "Yeronga Park Dolphins" . It catered for the very young, beginner type swimmers as well as the established swimmers. This Club is still in existence and although it caused some amount of friction , was of nuisance value only as Yeronga Park Amateur Swimming Club remained the parent club nominated by B.C.C.
